Bristol Water Fishery Report 1st April – 30th of April



BW Lakeside

April 2025 delivered a classic mix of British spring weather. We experienced everything from warm sunshine and still conditions to sudden downpours and powerful winds. In fact, three full days of boat fishing had to be cancelled across Chew and Blagdon due to high wind speeds, highlighting our continued commitment to angler safety. Temperatures fluctuated dramatically, with chilly mornings as low as 3°C and unseasonably warm afternoons peaking at 25°C. Winds were predominantly from the south, although occasional easterly and northerly gusts added variety to the conditions. Despite the wind disruptions, April remained mostly dry, leading to large hatches and falling water levels and in turn, some spectacular fishing.

Chew Valley Lake:

Fish Caught:

- **Top Patterns:** This was most definitely the month of the Nymphs, Diawl Bachs and Buzzers being a favourite with a coloured fly at the point when there was shade or just straight lining when the sun was bright. The most common lines used were the floating and the tip lines.
- **Best Areas:** The most productive areas of the lake were Wick and Moreton as well as herons.
- Rod Averages: Bank 4.69. Boat 6.34

This well-contested event saw fish largely located between Wick and Moreton, though some were caught from the Dam and Hollow Brook. Despite a fresh stocking earlier in the week, the newly introduced fish didn't feature prominently in the returns. Paul Golding claimed the top individual spot, while the team title went to Blagdon Fly Fishers. The competition was well-run under fair conditions and recorded a solid rod average of 8.7.

From there, the best anglers may earn the chance to represent England at international events. It's a prestigious pathway for serious competition anglers looking to perform at the highest level.

A sudden change in weather made fishing tricky, but also sparked an extraordinary surface rise—one of the most prolific in recent memory on Blagdon. Dave Reynolds secured first place, leading 21 anglers who qualified through to the next round.

Spread across 14 dates through the season, it's a great way to build consistency, meet other anglers, and enjoy the lakes in their prime evening conditions. Rhys Davis had some remarkable catches during the Osprey Competition on the 20th, and Ranger Rich Walker followed suit on the 22nd, landing a beautifully conditioned brown trout during the Evening League. Both catches exemplified the quality of fish that Blagdon is producing this spring.
